A big Thank you to all our donors!

What an incredible year 2023 was! A massive 237,735 shoeboxes were collected in the UK and have been sent to our church partners in Moldova, Romania, Ukraine, Belarus, Serbia, The Balkans, The Middle East, Central Asia and West Africa.

Donors from the UK together with those from America, Canada, South Korea, Australia, New Zealand, Austria, Spain, Switzerland, Finland and Germany collected an amazing 11.3 million shoeboxes! Which are blessing needy children, regardless of their gender, ethnicity or faith, in over 100 different countries.

Here are some shoebox Impact stories from receiving countries that we have received this year.



The Balkans

"We visited several families and spent time with each. They were amazed that children from across the world had packed shoebox gifts for them. We met a mother with four small children. The family live in poverty and were not expecting any presents for their kids. The children were so joyful when they saw the gifts. They were amazed that somebody remembered them. Receiving the gifts made them feel special and important. As well as toys and many interesting things the boxes were full of love!"

One partner from a small Baptist Church shared how Operation Christmas Child had 'opened many doors' in their community. They visited orphanages, schools and local families, many of whom were living in poverty. "We distributed 300 shoebox gifts which brought great joy and delight to the children. Many families first heard about God's love through the shoebox gifts."

Serbia

Timur's Story from Central Asia

Timur grew up in an orphanage in Central Asia where he received one pencil for each school term. When he opened an Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift, he rejoiced to find a whole packet of pencils!



In Romania, our Local Partners Shared:

"A ministry partner in the Cluj area decided they would share gifts with a group of young people with Down's Syndrome and with the families of women in Gherla prison. When they first arrived, they found that the children were nervous of visitors and scared they may be taken away from their home. But instead they were wonderfully surprised and full of joy to receive the unexpected gifts. It was moving to see the intensity with which a little girl hugged her new doll; and to see children sharing items with friends."
