What is a bully?

We believe a bully is someone who hurts someone not once, but repeatedly, by using targeted behaviour which is meant to hurt, frighten or upset.



We will always take it seriously!

Teachers will get involved to help end the problem. They will speak with all of the children involved and work to find a way to change the behaviour.

Parents may be contacted and there will be consequences for their actions but we will focus on rebuilding relationships and friendships.



If you are being bullied...



- Use eye contact and tell them to go away
- Ignore them and walk away
- Act like you don't care what they say or do
- Remember it is not your fault and you are not alone
- Speak to someone you trust

- Get angry
- Hit them
- Let them see a reaction
